Some Tips for Cleaning the Head

Your home toilet receives a plentiful washing and a dose of disinfectant every time it is flushed thanks to chlorinated city water piped to our homes. A marine head is different, whether flushed with sea water or fresh water. Flush volume is limited, as we like to stretch pumpouts, and often have to. Inevitably, a few spots and stains are often left behind.

Why is the "Head" called a "Head"?

In "the olden days", ships did not have bathrooms. When nature called, sailors would meander toward the bow of the boat. It was there they'd find a section of the deck that was simply covered with a grating and open to the sea below.

In nautical terms, head refers to the top or forward portion of a vessel. The head of the mast or the head of the bowsprit or the term dead ahead are examples. So when a sailor wanted to go forward he would simply say, "I need to go to the head of the ship". That terminology has stuck with us and to this day boaters still refer to the bathroom as the "head". The word head confusingly refers to both the room and the toilet.
